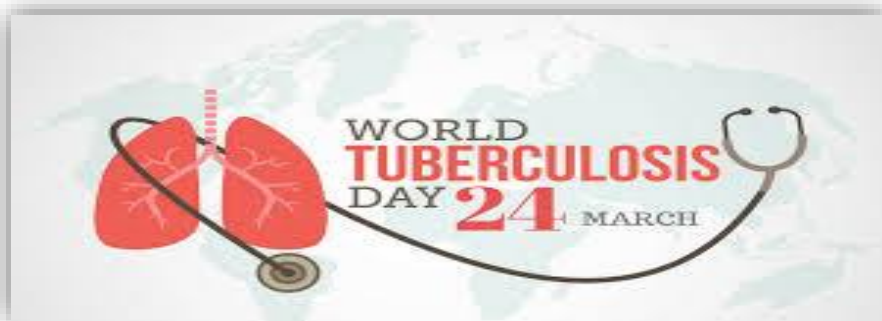

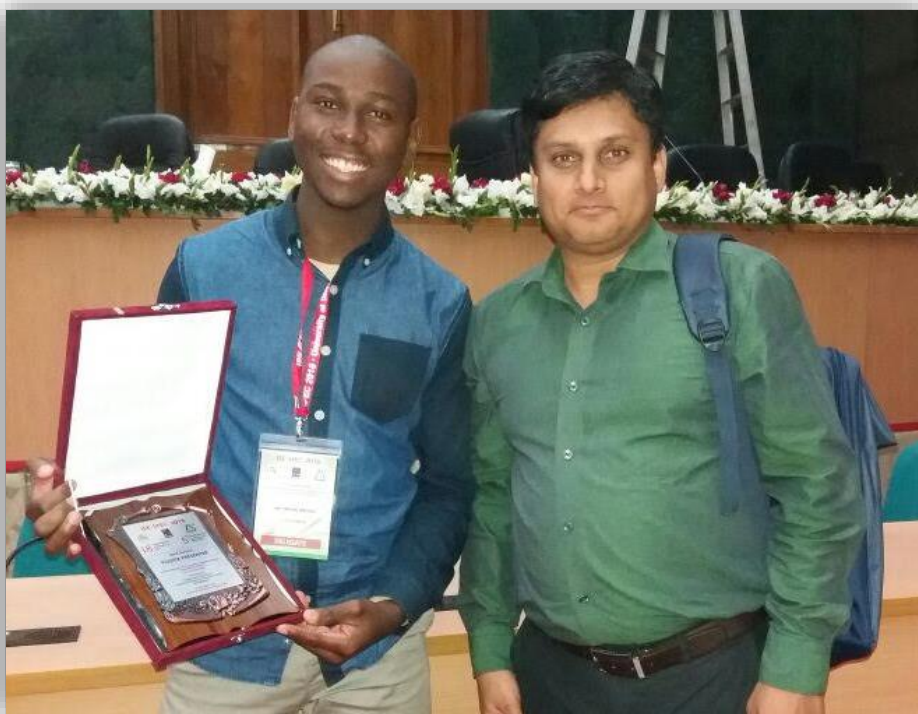

In memoriam

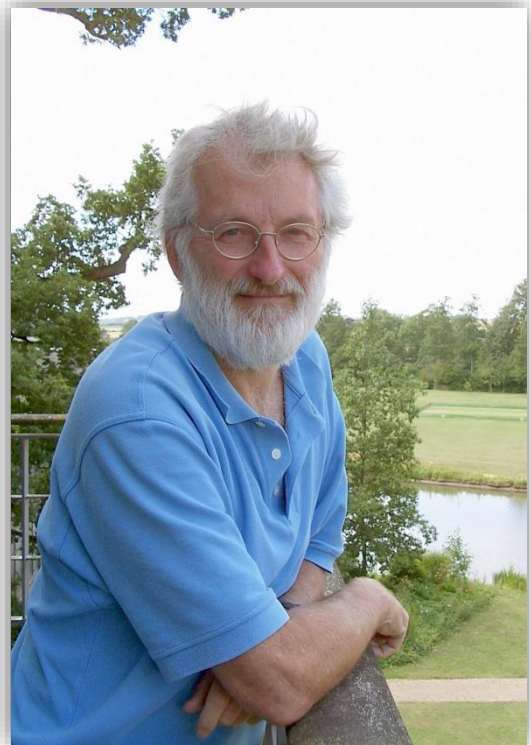
In the month of March, the world lost two prominent scientists.



Dr Stephen Hawking
1942 - 2018

As Prof Martin Rees, cosmologist and astrophysicist said: “Hawking’s life was shaped by the tragedy that struck him when he was only 22. He himself said that everything that happened since then was a bonus. And what a triumph his life has been. His name will live in the annals of science and millions have had their cosmic horizons widened by his best-selling books. He has also inspired millions by a unique example of achievement against all the odds – a manifestation of amazing willpower and determination.”

Dr John Sulston was known as a scientific visionary and leader. He made revolutionary breakthroughs and contributions to the scientific field, which led to the success of the Human Genome Project, one of the most important scientific endeavours of the past century. As he was quoted as saying: “From sharing, discovery is accelerated in the community.”
